



# Driving directions from Airport to Town&Country Resort Hotel

| 1. Head <b>northwest</b> on <b>Airport Terminal Rd</b> | 0.2 mi |
| 2. Keep left to stay on <b>Airport Terminal Rd</b>     | 0.2 mi |
| 3. Take the ramp to <b>I-5/Downtown</b>                | 0.5 mi |
| 4. Merge onto <b>N Harbor Dr</b>                       | 0.7 mi |
| 5. Turn left onto <b>W Laurel St</b>                   | 0.4 mi |
| 6. Turn left onto <b>India St</b>                      | 0.9 mi |
| 7. Take the ramp on the left onto <b>I-5 N</b>         | 1.6 mi |
| 8. Take the <b>I-8 E</b> exit toward <b>El Centro</b>  | 0.6 mi |
| 9. Keep left and merge onto <b>I-8 E</b>               | 1.5 mi |
| 10. Take the <b>Hotel Circle</b> exit                  | 449 ft |
| 11. Turn left onto <b>Hotel Cir S</b>                  | 0.5 mi |
| 12. Turn right   | 266 ft |

# San Diego Airport

Conveniently located just ten minutes from downtown San Diego and serviced by 22 major and commuter airlines including non-stop flights from Japan and the UK, San Diego International Airport, managed by the [San Diego County Regional Airport Authority](#), receives more than 16 million passengers a year. Flying into San Diego, passengers get a bird's eye view of Balboa Park, downtown and the San Diego Bay on their descent down to San Diego International Airport, aka Lindbergh Field. The airport terminals are easy to navigate and rarely crowded. Disembarking the plane, collecting luggage and getting out to the street often only takes a few minutes.

Getting to the airport? The Airport is served by I-5 with connections to State Route 163, I-8 and I-15.

### [Parking](#)

Whether you're looking for the convenience of valet parking, hourly or long-term options—San Diego International Airport has options to make taking off easier.

### [Taxis](#)

Taxis depart from the designated taxi zones located at the transit islands, on the Arrivals/Baggage Claim Level adjacent to each terminal. Taxi fares are approximately \$25US - \$30US/each way (not including tip).

### [Public Transportation](#)

There are a number of public transportation services available to you at any given time when you need to get to and from the Airport.

### [Cell Phone Lot](#)

Friends and family who are picking up arriving passengers can conveniently wait for them at the Airport's Cell Phone Waiting Lot.

### [Rental Cars](#)

Off-airport rental car agencies are served by free shuttle service from multiple locations throughout the terminals.

### [Shuttles](#)

Courtesy shuttles to participating San Diego-area hotels are located at the Hotel Courtesy Shuttle zones on the transit islands at terminals 1 and 2. Shuttle cost is approximately \$11US/each way/per person.

### [Biking & Walking](#)

To gain access to the airport via bicycle, San Diego offers a convenient bike & transit option that is safe and environmentally friendly.

## Travel Around San Diego

San Diego offers many modes of public transportation providing travelers with economical and eco-friendly options to explore the region.

### **San Diego Trolley**

If you're staying in and around downtown San Diego, the iconic bright red trolley will take you in and around the city. The San Diego Trolley provides convenient services from key locations downtown, including the Santa Fe Depot and the San Diego Convention Center, crisscrossing through downtown and out to various locations like Old Town and Mission Valley.

### **Rental Car**
